Fr Paul writes:

For the next five Sundays our Gospel readings come from Chapter 6 of the Gospel according to St. John. Since last November the Gospel excerpts have been taken from St. Mark. We are in what is called The Year of Mark. Because St. Mark's account is the shortest of all the four Gospels, the compliers of our Lectionary (The Book of Scripture Readings) decided to include this little block from St. John. Chapter 6 is known as "The Bread of Life" Chapter. When I was a student we were advised by those preparing us not to give all the wonderful things we have been told about Chapter 6 in one go because there were another four opportunities in the subsequent weeks!

Like last Sunday the picture is presented of the crowds seeking Jesus out. What is drawing them is not so much the person of Jesus but the signs (St John's word for "miracles") that have been associated with him like curing the sick. Jesus doesn't criticise them for this but uses Philip, one of the twelve apostles, to draw out that what Jesus is getting them to see that it's not the wonders that he does that matter rather that the wonders should draw out and encourage the gift of faith in each. When ultimately the crowd shows that it is more interested in the wonders and they want to take Jesus by force, he leaves them.

Today's excerpt stresses the importance of the participation of those present in what is a preview of what we call the Eucharist (or Mass) Jesus asks the crowd effectively "What have you got?" All realise that it is nowhere near the amount of food needed to feed them all. But that is not the point. Jesus does not ask us for what we have not got but for what (little) we have. In the hands of Jesus what we are prepared to share (our gifts, talents) works miracles and fills and satisfies.
